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The School

Holland Hall is an independent, coeducational, Episcopal day school that provides a challenging, comprehensive educational experience grounded in a rigorous liberal arts, college preparatory curriculum that promotes critical thinking and life-long learning. The 360 students attending ninth through twelfth grade abide by an honor code. Holland Hall's 38 Upper School faculty members have an average 22 years teaching experience and 61% hold advanced degrees, including 3 who hold a PhD. Historically, 100% of Holland Hall graduates attend post high school-graduate educational opportunities.

Holland Hall is recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for superior college preparation.

Facilities

Holland Hall's 162-acre south Tulsa campus includes creeks and ponds, an outdoor classroom, an eight-lane, all-weather track, and two cross-country trails loop through the woods. A dozen tennis courts, a golf putting & driving practice green, and fields for football, baseball, softball, field hockey, and soccer are also located on campus. Holland Hall's facility includes the 50,000-square-foot A.R. & Marylouise Tandy Dining and Wellness Center, All Saints Chapel, seven science labs, three libraries containing over 60,000 volumes, and the 70,000-square-foot Walter Arts Center designed for use by students and numerous arts organizations.

Accreditation and Membership

Holland Hall is accredited by the Independent Schools Association of the Southwest, recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, a member of the National Association of Independent Schools, National Association for College Admission Counseling, Great Plains Association for College Admission Counseling, Association of College Counselors in Independent Schools, College Board, National Association of Episcopal Schools, and since 1968, Cum Laude Society.

COVID-19 Grading Policy

From March through May of the 2019-20 school year, Holland Hall moved to virtual learning due to Covid-19. Because of the stress of this transition, we moved to a no harm grading policy. If students completed the work of remote learning satisfactorily, they earned the higher average (whether that was the average at spring break, when we moved to virtual classes, or the average at the end of the semester, including the work done during virtual learning). During the 2020-21 school year, we are planning for in-person school, while students have the option of doing classes from home. Due to the number limits created by social distancing protocols, we have had to cancel some of our course offerings.

Advanced Placement

Holland Hall will offer 6 AP courses in 2020-2021: Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Chemistry, Computer Science Principles, and Human Geography. All students enrolled in an AP course are required to take the AP exam, however, students are encouraged to sit for an AP exam if they feel they are proficient in any subject offered.

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STUDENT MATRICULATION
