Holland Hall is an independent, coeducational Episcopal day school in Tulsa, Oklahoma, serving students in Pre-K-12th grade. The Upper School (grades 9-12, 358 students) offers a rigorous liberal arts curriculum in a six-day modular schedule that encourages depth, balance and independence. Guided by an honor code and a strong sense of community, students are challenged to think critically, engage compassionately, and embrace lifelong learning. Faculty integrate research-based practices from Mind, Brain and Education (MBE) science into their teaching, preparing graduates for success in college and beyond. Holland Hall is recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for superior college preparation.
